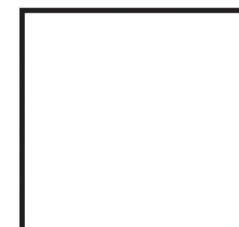

A LIFE-SAVING YEAR

27 Rescued Dogs

At the beginning of 2021, over 27 dogs were discovered in a hoarding situation and needed our immediate help. The dogs had been severely neglected; never seen sunlight, or known proper medical care. Many of them had injuries from frequent fights, eye infections, and respiratory infections due to their deteriorated living condition. Texas Humane Heroes answered the call to help save these 27 neglected dogs, treated their illnesses, and now all 27 are thriving in their forever homes!



Bringing Joy

Joy arrived at TXHH with only hours to spare before she was scheduled to be euthanized in a South Texas shelter. With a severe and painful tumor on her leg, she was at the top of the South Texas shelter's euthanasia list. When Joy arrived, our Medical Director, Dr. Kemerling, made the life-saving decision to amputate her leg to give her a better quality of life. After months of recovery, Joy was adopted into her new forever home!

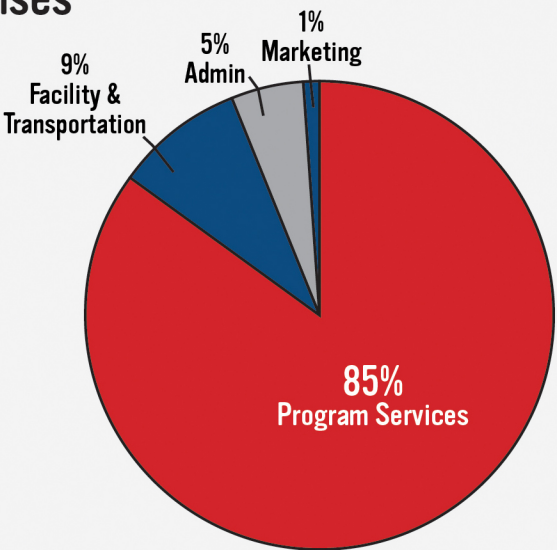

Pet Adoptions on Wheels



In 2021 we officially welcomed our new mobile adoption unit, the P.A.W. (Pet Adoptions on Wheels). The unit holds more than 20 adoptable dogs and cats. It can travel to festivals, events, farmer's markets, and off-site adoption events throughout Central Texas. The P.A.W. is a unique way to adopt the perfect pet while decreasing animal stress throughout the adoption preparation process.



ASPCA Hurricane Ida Rescue

During Hurricane Ida, hundreds of cats were displaced, but through our partnership with ASPCA, we saved 20 cats in an emergency rescue mission. This major cat transportation operation allowed local resources in Louisiana to continue to aid more homeless animals in the area who were impacted by the hurricane.



Shelter animals can harbor communicable illnesses for 14 days without showing symptoms. Our 14-Day Promise program gives adopters peace of mind when adopting a rescued animal. Adopters can bring their new pets back to our Adoption Center for no-cost, on-site treatment by our medical team if they show signs of illness within 14 days of adoption.

Three Mighty Pups

These three puppies arrived in our care with a severe case of mange. They had itchy, flaky skin, covered in sores and scabs. With our treatment, these three "Mighty Pups" made a full recovery. Their skin healed and they transformed into happy, playful puppies in their new forever homes!



Saving Parvo Puppies



Seven parvo positive puppies were dumped at a shelter in the cruel Texas heat, with a low chance of survival. After medical treatment from TXHH, they made a full recovery!
